DIY Cardboard Roll Projectors

What you will need:



Kitchen towel cardboard rolls, cling wrap or clear plastic, markers, rubber bands, torch

Let's have fun recognising letters and words today!

Instructions:

- 1. Using cling wrap or clear plastic, write letters or write words on it.
- 2. Using kitchen towel cardboard rolls, wrap the cling wrap with the letter or word over one end of the cardboard roll.
- 3. In a dark room, shine a flashlight through the open end of the cardboard roll against a wall or ceiling to create a DIY cardboard roll projector.
- 4. Do a letter/ word hunt with the cardboard roll projectors created.
- Letters/ words can be substituted with drawings or Chinese characters.





- Recognise letters and words
- Create a mini projector using recycled materials







Lemonade Vitamin C




What you will need:

Ingredients for lemonade (Lemons, sugar, water), Fruits (strawberries, peach)

Have a nice refreshing lemonade and a boost of Vitamin C!

Instructions:

- 1. Listen to the story "Maisy Makes Lemonade" by Lucy Cousins. (Reference: https://tinyurl.com/2vsucwhc)
- 2. Talk about how Maisy made lemonade for sharing with others.
- 3. Prepare lemon, sugar and water to make lemonade for a boost of Vitamin C.
- 4. Follow the steps to make lemonade (Refer to Annex)
- 5. Try out other lemonade recipes with other fruits like strawberries, peach and raspberries.

Annex: Steps to Make Lemonade



TEMONADE RECPES

for summer

BASIC LEMONADE



INGREDIENTS:

- 1 cup sugar
- 1 min wate
- 1 cup fresh lemon juice 6 cups water

DIRECTIONS

- Add the sugar and 1 cup water to a pan and bring to a boil, stirring to help dissolve the sugar. Cool 15 minutes.
- Add the sugar water, lemon juice, 6 cups water, and ice to a pitcher.
- 3. Mix to combine, and serve



LAVENDER LEMONADE Lemonade + 2 tbsp edible dried lavender



BASIL LEMONADE Lemonade + 1/2 cup (packed) fresh chopped basil



CUCUMBER LEMONADE Lemonade + 1 peeled and sliced cucumber



RASPBERRY LEMONADE Lemonade + 2 cups



MINT LEMONADE Lemonade + 2 tbsp chopped mint



SPARKLING LEMONADE Lemonade + 5 cups club soda



GINGER LEMONADE Lemonade + 1-1/2 tbsp fresh ginger, minced





Letter BINGO

What you will need:

Paper, marker, Lego pieces/ coins



Let's have fun with a letter sound BINGO game!

Instructions:

- 1. On a piece of paper, draw a 4 by 4 grid.
- 2. List some letters in each square to create a letter BINGO card.
- 3. Prepare individual letters on smaller pieces of paper and place them in a cup.
- 4. Get your child to pick a letter from the cup and name the letter name and sound.
- 5. Encourage your child to find the letter on the BINGO card and cover it using a Lego piece or coin.
- 6. Aim to cover as many letters as possible on the BINGO card.
- 7. Extend the activity further by asking your child to copy write the letters.

The Tiger Who Came to Tea



What you will need:

Teacups, saucers, teaspoons and cookies

Enjoy a tea party with your child and practise 1 to 1 correspondence!

Instructions:

- 1. Listen to the story "The Tiger Who Came to Tea" by Judith Kerr. (Reference: https://tinyurl.com/z7e6878w)
- 2. Prepare some teacups, saucers and teaspoons for your child to lay it on a table.
- 3. Emphasise that each teacup will go along with 1 saucer and 1 teaspoon.
- 4. Prepare some cookies and pour some water into each teacup. Enjoy the 'tea party' with your child!



- Match objects with 1 to 1 correspondence
- Express myself through pretend play





Ten Black Dots

What you will need:

Paper, colouring materials, scissors




Engage your child in a fun counting and drawing activity!

Instructions:

- Listen to the story "Ten Black Dots" by Donald Crews (Reference: https://tinyurl.com/2dznjwhk)
- 2. Use a black marker or coloured pencil to draw and cut out 10 black dots.
- 3. Encourage your child to count the number of dots.
- 4. Let your child to use their imagination to form any drawing using the dots.
- 5. Talk about their drawings ("4 dots can make 4 flowers in the garden.")
